Trustee Buono – Ulster County Transportation meeting, there is no money for the TAP grant. UCAT bus routes, they will be evaluating the routes. Ask about the last meeting discussion about Livingston Street, what was decided? The Mayor stated the speed limit is 25MPH. The Police set up the radar detector and was put there for two weeks. Children at Play signs, the crosswalks painted. Mayor said he and Chief Nuzzo will take a look at where stop signs to be placed.

Trustee Parisian — The program that Mary was discussing, A local lead State supported program to empower municipalities to take action to improve and protect their public water sources and surrounding environment. The program offers free technical assistance to develop and implement community specific drinking water source protection plans. DWSP2 will help work off previous work, help align priorities. Trustee Parisian printed out the form, contact name Mike Hopf, alternate name Mike Karashay. Trustee Parisian will fill out the form and submit.

Trustee Zink – Waterfront Advisory met, there were couple of questions, water elevation. Not sure if there will be another meeting or not, but if there is I will report on that. Nina Schmidbauer and I have formed a Farmer's Market Club, stop by.

Deputy Mayor Mayer – Art Commission meet and greet on 23rd of July. Spring Fling at the Black Walnut Farm, Mayor accepting the 2024 Lifetime Achievement Award for Alex Wade (posthumously) and Robert Langdon – 2024 Community Service Award given to Robert Langdon, 2024 Spirit of Saugerties Award to Sue Sachar. Mum Queen and court are ready for the 4th of July parade. Continuing to work on Woodstock 94 celebration, DPW is putting up the flags. The Tina Chorvas park Friday night, Rich Forbes has set up for the concert. TV 23 is airing all of the interviews that Gus has done for Woodstock 94.

Mayor Murphy Alex's dedication of the bench at the Kiersted House Celebration of Alex's life. It was a nice turn out.

Text MyGov – discussion, extending proposal through July. Trustee Hackett asked if it would be a public service? Mayor explained it would be directed to residents that need to be informed. Trustee Zink, I have concerns about the expense following a tax increase. I anticipate if the vote is taken at this meeting or next meeting, I will vote no, I want to be financially cautious. Trustee Buono I don't think we need it, don't take anything personal. We have people in the office, people with cell phones, we Facebook pages, people can come to meetings, our cell phones are out there, we don't need to do this expense. Paula stated the number of phone calls that come into the office every day. Mayor's concern is that it won't limit the phone calls, the money would be wasted if it's not used. Can there be a demo of program? Trustee Parisian did some research on Text MyGov, reviewed the municipalities that have joined, the \$4K or \$5K would go into the budget doesn't go away, we need to look at reducing our expenses at this time. The expense was a concern across the board with other municipalities.

Paul Kerbert – Treasurer as of today we received \$1,970,051.00 in taxes, leaves roughly \$573,000.00 left to collect, today was the last day without penalties.

Trustee Hackett made a motion to Adjourn the Village Board Meeting. Trustee Zink seconded the motion to Adjourn the Village Board Meeting. All in favor, the motion carried unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 6:21PM.
